Rule 4(1) Information

- a) The proposition contributes to the States' objectives and policy plans by reducing the size of the 2026 deficit to seek to move towards a sustainable fiscal position, i.e., matching revenue, expenditure, infrastructure investment and reserves over the long term.
- b) In preparing the proposition, consultation has been undertaken with the Policy & Resources Committee.
- c) The proposition has been submitted to His Majesty's Procureur for advice on any legal or constitutional implications.
- d) The financial implications to the States of carrying the proposal into effect are a reduction in revenue expenditure of £27.35m compared to the proposed 2026 Budget.
- e) Drafting advice has been sought from the States' Greffier. Advice has been sought from Treasury Officers.

Explanatory note

When the forecast cash deficit for 2026 is £115m, we must act. This amendment holds next year's committee spending broadly at this year's level, saving the States £27 million: a measured step to restore fiscal discipline — not austerity, but realism — at a time when pay growth and service costs are running ahead of revenue.

The intention is not to undermine essential services, but to signal a clear commitment to fiscal discipline and value for money at a time when public confidence in States spending is low. By adopting this amendment, the States would send a strong message that Guernsey's government must live within its means, focus on delivery and demonstrate that efficiency and reform are more than slogans.

This amendment proposes to replace the proposed Committee Net Expenditure budgets with 2025 forecast expenditure, with certain exceptions.

- The proposed 2026 Budgets for the following areas have been retained as they are below the 2025 forecast: Economic Development, Policy & Resources Committee; States' Trading Supervisory Board and Royal Court.
- The proposed 2026 Budget for the Committee for Education, Sport & Culture and the formula-led estimate for the Committee for Employment & Social Security have also been retained.

A revised version of the Income and Expenditure Account in Appendix V of the Budget Report is shown below.
