To insert an additional proposition as follows:

“To direct the Policy & Resources Committee to publish a report on the progress of the Major Projects Portfolio, including relevant information and metrics on each project’s performance against plan and budget, in a format that is publicly available and easily accessible, no later than 1st July 2026, with updates provided at least every six months thereafter; and to agree to mandate the Chief Executive to report on major workstreams underway in the public service as part of an annual Chief Executive’s report.”

Rule 4(1) Information

- a) This proposition contributes to the States’ objectives and policy plans by ensuring progress information on the States’ Major Projects is publicly available.
- b) Consultation has not been undertaken in preparing this proposition.
- c) The proposition has been submitted to His Majesty’s Procureur for advice on any legal or constitutional implications.
- d) There are no direct financial implications of carrying the proposal into effect.
- e) Drafting advice has been sought from the States’ Greffier and advice has been sought from the officers of the Policy & Resources Committee.

Explanatory Note

The States' largest long-term investments sit within the Major Projects Portfolio, ranging from the Affordable Housing Development Programme and Our Hospital Modernisation to MyGov and the Electronic Patient Record. These projects are not included in the Government Work Plan ("GWP"). Instead, the Policy & Resources Committee will publish its proposal for an updated Major Projects Portfolio later this year.

The Policy & Resources Committee and the relevant sponsoring Committees already receive regular progress updates on Major Projects. While there will be resource implications in collating and preparing public reports based on this information, six-monthly reporting on Major Projects will support more open and transparent government, particularly in demonstrating how money has been spent.

This reporting will supplement the existing updates provided through the annual report on extant Resolutions, Committee Work Plans, and Committee Statements. The Amendment also clearly mandates the Chief Executive & Head of the Public Service to publish an annual report, as is his intention, which will include updates on major workstreams underway across the public service.
