**1      Executive Summary**

- 1.1      The purpose of this Policy Letter is to formally recommend to the States the re-appointment of Mrs Bonita Louise Hamilton as an ordinary member of the Police Complaints Commission (“the Commission”) for a further period of 4 years, with effect from the end of her current term of appointment.

**2      Background**

- 2.1      The Commission was established under the Police Complaints (Guernsey) Law, 2008 (“The Law”)<sup>1</sup> and came into effect on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2011. The Commission comprises a Chairman and five ordinary Members.
- 2.2      The Commission’s role is to provide independent oversight of the investigation of complaints made by members of the public against the conduct of police officers employed in the Guernsey Police Force. The Commission also has a role in considering appeals against decisions made in relation to complaints made by members of the public.

**3      Constitution**

- 3.1      The Schedule to the Law sets out the composition of, and appointment process to, the Commission. The following parts are relevant.

- 3.2 Paragraph 1(1) of the Schedule states that *“The Commission shall consist of a Chairman and five ordinary members.”*
- 3.3 Paragraph 1(2) states that *“The Chairman and ordinary members shall be appointed by the States on the recommendation of the Committee”.*
- 3.4 Paragraph 1(4) states that *“the Chairman and ordinary members shall be appointed for a term of four years.”*
- 3.5 Paragraph 1(6) states that *“Members of the Commission may be reappointed.”*

#### **4 Re-Appointment of Ordinary Member**

- 4.1 The Committee *for* Home Affairs is pleased to recommend Mrs Hamilton for re-appointment as an ordinary member of the Commission. Mrs Hamilton was first appointed by the States at its meeting on 1st July 2011 for a four-year term, and her current term is due to end on 30th June 2025.
- 4.2 Throughout her tenure, Mrs Hamilton has consistently demonstrated the skills and expertise required to fulfil the role effectively. She is adept at reviewing and analysing complex investigations, making well-reasoned and balanced decisions, and clearly articulating her rationale to fellow members.
- 4.3 Mrs Hamilton is a highly respected member of the Commission and has its full support for re-appointment. She has confirmed her willingness to continue in the role and has the capacity and flexibility to prepare for and attend meetings as required. Her ability to handle sensitive and confidential information with discretion and integrity has been evident throughout her service.

#### **5 Compliance with Rule 4**

- 5.1 Rule 4 of the Rules of Procedure of the States of Deliberation and their Committees sets out the information which must be included in, or appended to, motions laid before the States.
- 5.2 In accordance with Rule 4(1):
  - a) The propositions contribute to the States’ objectives in ensuring that the Commission can appropriately discharge its statutory duties.
  - b) In preparing the propositions, there has been no consultation with stakeholders.

c) The propositions have been submitted to His Majesty's Procureur for advice on any legal or constitutional implications.

d) There are no financial implications to the States of carrying the proposal into effect.

5.3 In accordance with Rule 4(2), the propositions relate to the duties of the Committee to advise the States and to develop and implement policies on matters relating to its purpose including law enforcement, including policing and customs.

5.4 The propositions have the unanimous support of the Committee.
