No flights paid for by the States have been taken this term by political members of the SMC in relation to the business of the SMC.

# Question 4:

Which hotels paid for by the States did each political member of the Scrutiny Management Committee stay and for which nights during October 2020 – March 2024.

#### Question 6:

What was the total cost of air fares, hotels and any other expenditure, including any standard day allowances in relation to the out of the island trips representing the States for each trip taken during the period October 2020 – March 2024 by each political member.

# Question 9:

In relation to previous Rule 6 (now numbered 11) questions on each members travel and expenditure during 2011 Deputy Trott as Chief Minister wrote 'in the spirit of moving towards more open and transparent Government, it is intended that information of this type will be provided as a matter of course in the next administration'. As this didn't happen questions were repeated in January 2015 addressed to Deputy Le Tocq as Chief Minister, when replying he stated 'The Policy Council has no objection to the general publication of Deputies travel expenditure when representing the island outside the Bailiwick on a regular basis and that an appropriate frequency would be annul publication. As Deputy Trott & Deputy Le Tocq both as Chief Ministers at various times sought publishing States members travel details as above, and neither have pursued this happening, will the President of the Scrutiny Management Committee give assurances in the interest of transparency and accountability an annual detailed report covering the above will be published in the public domain, highlighting each States members travel details, costs and the reason for the trip?

#### Response:

The SMC supports the principle of openness and transparency and, should a central register of travel and costs for all deputies such as is referred to in this question be established, the SMC will of course adhere to any requirements for reporting and disclosure. However, the question as written could be

seen to imply that it should be the responsibility of the SMC to do this for all States Members and, if that was the intention, we would respectfully point out that such work would not fall under the mandate of the SMC.

#### Question 10:

Would you agree that changes need to be made and that in the interest of transparency and accountability States members trips away on States business should be circulated to all Deputies within a reasonable time after the trip?

# Response:

If such a register is to be established, then it should be done centrally and not through individual Committees given that not all travel undertaken is for the Committee that a deputy sits on, and not all deputies are members of a Committee. Further, it is considered that sending details to all deputies of every trip individually is excessive and in the event of it being agreed that such information should be published, annual publication would suffice.
