- 1 In 2022 Guernsey’s household recycling rate fell under the 70 per cent target for the first time since the current recycling and waste system was put in place in 2019. The annual rate in 2022 was 68 per cent down from 71 % in 2021, 72 % in 2020 and a high of 73% in 2019. Recycling appears to be regressing. Is therefore the amount of island waste being shipped or exported increasing?
 - 2 Given the concerns over the deficit at Guernsey Waste and new charges being brought in to try to compensate for losses, raises the question of whether Guernsey Waste is recovering the true value of recyclables. What was the revenue recovered from recyclables in total and by category (aluminium, tin, scrap metal, plastic, cardboard, paper) for the years 2019 and 2022?
