1	I would like to ask the following question with regard to the increase in numbers of individuals requiring inpatient treatment associated with cannabis use.
	Specialist Mental Health Services have raised concerns in the recently published Mental Health and Wellbeing Strategy Annual Report 2023 regarding the increase in the numbers of individuals requiring inpatient treatment associated with cannabis use, including cannabis induced psychosis. Given the negative impact the drug is having on individuals, carers and the mental health service here, why is the Committee for Health & Social Care not bringing in immediate new restrictions on the prescribing, distribution and use of medical cannabis?
